Hello. Daniel here. The Mission has given me a foundation to restart my life the right way.

Life started out ok through high school. I got married, then divorced. A year later, I tried drugs and started drinking more heavily. Painkillers

came next-- then heroin. I used to tell myself no heroin ever. That led me to detox, and a new desire to make good choices.

After my uncle died, the wheels came off. I drowned my feelings in drugs. Then I lost a cousin in my support network and that

really shook me. I became homeless and lived on the streets for a month.

Soul-searching time. I dove headfirst into a sober program, stayed clean for several months, and checked into the Mission. People who live here may have a tough exterior, but inside we're kind, caring, and will do what we can to help each other.

Hi I'm Mark. At the Mission, you can get help, but you have to do the work of recovery yourself.

I inherited my mother's functional alcoholism early. I ended up dropping out of school, drinking, drugging, and living on the street. At 23 I went to jail. When I got out, the crack epidemic took me down for several years.

and landed a steady
job upon release.
They say

the disease to rest, but it can resurface, and it did. For years, alcohol beat me down and my age didn't help. One morning I crawled into Mass General and told my doctor I needed help.

When I made it to the Mission, I was surrounded by a great group of clean and sober people. If it wasn't for the Mission, I'd probably still be out there drinking.
